Canvas I for Instruction:

If you are new to Canvas, this is the place to start! Take a tour of Cuesta College's supported Learning Management System (LMS), and begin to create an interactive learning space. During the session, you will learn how to navigate the LMS, create simple canvas pages for content and resources, setting your home page, create assignments, look at the gradebook, and upload files! This session is jam-packed, bring a snack!

Canvas II for Instruction:

During this workshop, you will have a chance to experiment with advanced tools, utilize less common and more advanced features in your online course. A deeper look at the Canvas Gradebook, create content pages with embedded resources. Look at time saving strategies for participating and grading discussions as well as best practices for traditional discussion boards. What to see something new, in this session we will look at alternatives to discussion boards.

Canvas for Non-Instruction:

This course is for administrative assistants, clerks, tutors, and other that support student success. This workshop will take you on a tour of the Cuesta College Supported Learning Management System (LMS). You will interact with canvas from a student perspective by learning how to navigate the environment, view grades, post discussions, create and respond to messages, and submit assignments.

Creating an online presence is easier than you think. Using video conferencing for online office hours, assisting students through screen sharing, and collaborating in groups. Come try it out, sign up for a free educator's account and more.

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Creating Accessible Content for your Students

By law, materials for all courses must be accessible to all learners at the start of a course, regardless of who is enrolled. This session will focus on the three major steps you can take to make your materials accessible. 1) making documents accessible to a screen reader, 2) providing alternative text for images and 3) ensuring videos are captions accurately.
